The Session took the following actions at their August 18, 2020 stated meeting:

• Approved a motion from the Worship and Music Committee to have communion the first Sunday in September. Tentatively this may be a drive-through service, with guidelines from the Safety Team.

At that meeting, Rebekah Tucker-Motley shared her desire to enter the Doctorate of Ministry program through Pittsburgh Theological Seminary, in conjunction with the University of Edinburgh. Session informally supported her.
