An Idea for Advent

In Matthew 25, verses 37-40, it says, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you? The King will reply, I tell you the truth, whatever you did for the least of these, you did for me."

As we read this, and think about the coming of Advent, consider what you can do to help our OPC food ministry of the Blessing Box. The Advent calendar below is one way to help. You could take this on yourself, or with a friend.

The idea is to provide 1 food item per day, Dec. 1 through Dec. 24. Bring it all to OPC for the Blessing Box ministry. Following is what we suggest:

Dec. 1—a box of cereal Dec. 13—chicken noodle soup

Dec. 2—jar of peanut butter Dec. 14—tomato soup

Dec. 3—jar of jelly Dec. 15—box of crackers

Dec. 4—mac & cheese package Dec. 16—can of mixed vegetables

Dec. 5—a can of fruit Dec. 17—a dessert mix like jello or pudding

Dec. 6—can of tomatoes Dec. 18—can of corn

Dec. 7—can of tuna or chicken or ham Dec. 19—package of rice

Dec. 8—can of sweet potatoes Dec. 20—oatmeal

Dec. 9—can or bag of beans Dec. 21—can of pasta & sauce

Dec. 10—jar of applesauce Dec. 22—can of green beans

Dec. 11—pasta Dec. 23—bar of soap

Dec. 12—jar or can of spaghetti sauce Dec. 24—box of instant potatoes

Session Meeting Highlights

At its November 17th stated meeting, the Session, among other actions:

- Approved proposed changes to the terms of call. These will be presented to the congregation at the next congregational meeting for approval. The Finance Committee recommended that the pastor's continuing education allowance for 2021 be increased from \$1,250 to \$3,000 (this figure includes unused continuing education money from 2020). The Covenant Review Team recommended that the pastor's study leave increase from two weeks to three weeks in 2021. Both of these changes are in response to the pastor beginning her advanced degree program in 2021.
- With input from the Endowment chair and Finance Committee chair, the Session looked at policies regarding the use of endowment funds for various expenses currently paid for out of the general fund. The Session determined that it was within those policies that some budget line items such as piano and organ maintenance be covered by the appropriate building endowment fund. The benevolence fund will also be used for benevolences rather than using the general fund for those projects.

- Approved the Property Committee's recommendation that the Office on Youth Blood Drive in December be moved to Friday January 8, 2021.
- Approved the Covenant Review Team's recommendation to temporary restructure the church administrator's position to allow for a minimum 3.5 hour work week with flexible office hours.

On Dec 13 at 11:00 am, we will be having a Congregational meeting. This meeting is to elect the Carole Sue Graves class of 2023 session members, the 2021 nominating committee, and approve the 2021 pastor's terms of call.

Out of an abundance of caution, and to follow the safety protocols of our Safety Team, this meeting is structured somewhat differently.

Depending on your health and your comfort level, you can choose any of the following options. You can sit in the sanctuary, socially distanced. (a maximum of 25 people can be safely seated) You can sit in relative isolation in the East Room and listen through the East Room's speaker (a maximum of 10 people can be safely seated) You can stand just outside the door and listen through the Narthex's speaker. You can remain in your car.

A ruling elder will be in the East room and another will be outside to facilitate questions and votes. Both Con Ed/Books - \$3,000 (a portion of this is rollover will have wireless microphones so that anyone outside of the sanctuary can address the meeting.
