

One Great Hour of Sharing Offering

Lent is traditionally a season of fasting and prayer. During this time, Christians pay close attention to spiritual disciplines that deepen our understanding of what God is doing in our lives and in the world.



Jesus' ministry was among those who were most vulnerable. He preached good

news to the poor and release to the captives. One Great Hour of Sharing helps us share this same good news to those same vulnerable people in our world today: those who are hungry, who are suffering from disaster, who are dealing with oppression in society.

Your gifts to this offering are split between Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA), Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP), and Self Development of People (SDP). Session Meeting Highlights

During the March session meeting, a number of recommendations from committees were discussed and approved along with discussion of other items.

- Mission and Outreach A mission luncheon with a speaker will be held in October.
- Property A defibrillator will be purchased and placed in the narthex.
- Spiritual Formation A Pray Station curriculum guide for April through August that ties multimedia resources to the lectionary will be developed in early April.
- Worship and Music A new Book of Common Worship will be purchased to help with worship services in the absence of a permanent pastor.
- Congregational Care Money was collected on March 18 for the college and boarding school student gift cards.
- **Covenant Review -** A separation payment of \$104 each will be given to Rialand and Veronica Tucker in recognition of their 11 years of service to OPC. Custodial responsibilities during the month of April will be taken care of by volunteers. Committee ministry goals for 2018 were discussed.

Other business:

- A permanent Stewardship Team will be formed no later than June.
- Next steps for discussions between the church and the preschool board were discussed and approved.
- The 2017 Nominating Committee will be asked to pick their successors in preparation for election at a congregational meeting in the near future. The 2018 Nominating Committee will immediately be given the task of nominating additional elders to serve on session.
- The charge presented on behalf of the OPC Session at Rev. Liz Hulme Adam's installation as pastor of Tabor Presbyterian Church on March 11, 2018 will be included in the session minutes.



Is Burnout a Problem for Us at OPC?

The March 2018 edition of our Presbytery's newsletter, The Vine, has an excellent article on burnout. It describes burnout as a "particularly common problem in smaller churches." According to this article, "symptoms of burnout include feeling overwhelmed, frustrated, disappointed in self and others, cynicism, defeat and apathy."

Does this sound like a problem for us?

Consider some of the verbatim comments from our 2017 Covenant Review Survey

- Not willing to serve on Session.
- Need more involvement by more members
- No one wants to volunteer
- Slowing pace of volunteerism. It is getting harder and harder to engage members in the work of the church or activities.
- There is a lot of apathy and a lack of true enthusiasm in this congregation. Maybe this is a symptom of congregational burnout.
- We continue to think like a larger church than we are. We need to proactively scrutinize and prioritize everything we do in order to cut back on at least half of it. The alternative is continued volunteer burnout where we deal with the urgent but rarely the important.

Again, the question, does this sound like a problem for us?

The Covenant Review Team discussed this issue and answered with a resounding "yes." This is a problem at OPC. In fact, we felt like this may be one of the most serious issues we face as a church family. We, therefore, made a recommendation to Session that we not stick our heads in the sand about this serious issue and instead try to proactively address it. Session agreed, resulting in the following announcement in our bulletin in recent weeks.

Volunteers Needed: In response to our Annual Survey, Session has approved a Covenant Review Team recommendation to form a new short-term Volunteer Sustainability Team that will convene to make recommendations on or before June 21 to Session regarding ways to inspire volunteers without being overburdened. This group will explore ways to make our volunteer time more meaningful while minimizing the risk of burnout. We currently have 3 volunteers and would like a minimum of 5. If you feel you are too busy with church activities already, you are a perfect candidate for this team! That's the challenge we are trying to address. Please join this group by contacting Lloyd, Mike, or Ralph.

As of this writing, we have no other volunteers. Again, does this sound like a problem for us?! If you have felt this way, we need you!

- Newsletter Deadline 4th Friday of each month by 9:00 am


