

### From the Pastor

I like being a transitional minister, because of its specificity and because I know you know you aren't stuck with me. That gives me a certain liberty, to say hard things, to offer new angles and reflect back to you what I see. It gives you flexibility in exploring what you want and don't want. I also like being YOUR interim minister. You have been an engaged and exploratory church. We've tried new approaches to worship, we've built the Blessing Box, and collaborated in ministry with other churches. We've endured and come through some financial ambiguity. We've completed a Mission Study with wide participation. We've attended to those in need and said goodbye to too many of our cherished members. Recently we've offered new opportunities for fellowship and tracked what matters to you.

But we've had some failures too. You can name those from your own vantage and I can name them from mine. What we consider failure will vary from person to person. But failure isn't the enemy. Complacency, inertia, cynicism - these are the enemy. Failure just means we're not there yet and have to try again or try anew. I'm less concerned about failure and more concerned about the tendency to give up.

People nationwide are giving up on church. People don't agree on a definitive diagnosis or the cure, but the numbers are clear and stark. I can't get through a week without reading a story about the statistics, and the attendant hand-wringing (or denial!). I'm in a group with other members of the Presbytery to explore this topic and what to do about it. In the time I have left I will be sharing with you what this information means for OPC.

I've been preaching a lot lately about Jesus as the WAY. Maybe one of the ways "the church" has alienated people within and outside the body is the tendency for church to say there's an answer and we have the right question. Or, to say whatever your question - we have the an-



swer, the right one. We do, there's truth to that, but the answer is not a line from our Book of Confessions. The answer is a person, a person with whom we are asked to be in relationship.

When we are in relationship with Jesus, our relationships improve, because he gives us the WAY. Just as important, when we are in relationship with Jesus, we are also in relationship with his people you and me and the body of Christ. We may not like what that ends up looking like on any given day, but that's what we need.

What did Jesus say to those early disciples? He simply said, "Follow me." When we take that step, the WAY may not be smooth-sailing but the way saves us from cynicism and anxiety about the future. Whatever the state of the church, at large or here in Orange, when we are in relationship with Jesus and authentic relationship with each other we can meet success and failure with love and hope.
