### From the Pastor

Dear Members and Friends,

I begin with a shout-out to Melanie, Ryder and Sierra, for showing up consistently for worship. Sierra is shaping up to be an attentive theologian! As "friends of the church" they have committed to the rhythm of worship and the importance of fellowship. I raise them up because I am looking ahead at what will be important for your next minister. Your next minister will need you to show up. Embedded in the word "discipleship" is discipline. A healthy congregation requires disciples who take seriously the commitments to service, worship and fellowship. We are impoverished when one of you is not in our midst - we need the variety and challenge of everyone's presence.

The Mission Study Team is wrapping up its responsibilities. As we give our reports and meet with the Committee on Ministry about next steps, we invite you to continue your own contribution to the process by praying for the church. You can also consider what makes for a good relationship with your next pastor. Here are some suggestions I borrow from others who do interim work - I think they're a good start:

1. Make an effort to get to know your pastor and become known by him or her. Seek to understand as well as to be understood. Deep relationships

require time, to be sure; they also require shared experiences and commitment and effort from both sides.

- 2. Communication is key. Aim to be honest and forthright, direct instead of indirect. Avoid speaking through others or on behalf of others. Expect and ask for the same from your pastor.
- 3. When there are concerns (there are always concerns!), speak personally with the pastor, not anonymously or through messengers. Don't let concerns fester and become wedges that undermine trust or jeopardize the relationship.
- 4. Respect that boundaries are essential to any relationship. Availability is important, but also unavailability, especially in a digital age when many of us stay online (guilty!). A pastor will be your confidant, your spiritual support, a teacher and guide, but pastors are in need of the same, outside the church she/he serves. For longevity pastors need opportunities for renewal and time away.

Next month I will address the topic of the pastor's role and accountabilities. It will be important for the church and the pastor to maintain a shared understanding about both.


### **Preschool Corner**

## **Mission Study Team**

The Mission Study Team wants to thank everyone again for your active participation in multiple surveys and small group meetings. Your input has been invaluable. We have incorporated your perspectives into a Ministry Information Form (MIF) that will be used as the basis of our search for a permanent pastor. The *draft* report will be distributed at the Annual Congregational Meeting on Sunday, February 5. The following Sunday, February 12, we will hold a discussion and feedback session after worship for anyone who would like to provide additional comments.

The *final* report will be submitted to Session by the end of February in preparation for a meeting with the Presbytery regarding our pastor search options. Carson Rhyne, General Presbyter, Presbytery of the James, will be here Sunday, March 12 to lead worship and meet with Session and the Mission Study Team afterward, regarding options for next steps.

The total *draft* report will be close to 100 pages primarily composed of actual survey and feedback results. The initial section, approximately 5 pages, provides an overview and our congregation's answers to questions found on the PC(USA) Ministry Information Form. The questions basically summarize who we are and what we are looking for. This is the portion we will distribute by hard copy at the Congregational Meeting. The other 95 pages will be available by email or hard copy upon request from Melanie.


What makes us hopeful is that at a level surprising to many of us, based on anonymous surveys, multiple small group discussions, and one on one interviews, there is a strong consensus and growing unity of spirit around virtually every issue we face. That is not to say we agree on everything, but we have reached a point where we can celebrate and respect different opinions that accompany that unity. In short, there is a sense that we are ready to move on and embrace the future.
