Recent history:

2018 - 180 cans were collected, 90 contributed to the Blessing Box and 90 contributed to Love Outreach Food Pantry

\$57 was collected and was used to purchase items for the Blessing Box

2017 - 408 cans were collected and contributed to Love Outreach Food Pantry

2016 - 242 cans were collected and contributed to Love Outreach Food Pantry

2015 - 251 cans were collected and contributed to Love Outreach Food Pantry

January Session Meeting Highlights

- We welcomed our newly elected Elders to our January meeting with many thanks for being willing to serve Carole Sue Graves, Ralph Graves, and Ted Haberland. Carole Sue and Ralph will be installed on January 27. Ted will be installed on March 3.
- Margaret Thompson was reappointed treasurer and May Saxton was reappointed Clerk of Session, both for a one year term. Ralph Graves will serve as Assistant Clerk.
- Committee/Team assignments for 2019 (chairs and liaisons) were discussed and will be finalized at our February meeting.
- Session continues to review revisions for the OPC
 Administrative Manual. In January we reviewed
 and approved, as amended, Funeral and Memorial
 Service Policy and Duty Elder Guidelines for a
 Funeral or Memorial Service.
- Congregational Care: A motion was made and approved to collect money for care cards for college students on Sundays, January 20 and 27.
- Mission and Outreach: Guidelines were discussed for handling requests that come to OPC for financial help for individuals. It was decided that such requests be referred to the Christian Emergency Council, to which OPC contributes in a variety of ways. Exceptions would include Christmas gifts determined to be designated for specific families.
- Spiritual Formation: A motion was made and approved to collect \$1 contributions on February 3 for Souper Bowl Sunday for use in purchasing food to add to the Blessing Box.
- Worship and Music
 - A motion was made and approved to place the new hymnals in the sanctuary for the

- February 10 Worship Service with a brief Service of Dedication and a time of recognition for those who have been honored or remembered.
- A motion was made and approved that, because we do not have a pastor at this time, we will not have an Ash Wednesday service, but we will encourage attendance of the Community Lenten Service at noon at St. Thomas Episcopal Church.
- A motion was made and approved that we hold a Maundy Thursday service on April 18, at the discretion of the supply pastor.
- Elders Davies and Graves (Carole Sue) were elected as commissioners (one voting, one non-voting) to the Presbytery of the James Stated Meeting on Saturday, February 16 at Three Chopt Church in Richmond.

Many thanks to Nancy Crowder and Shirley Newman for their many years of service as Elders. Shirley has served three terms and Nancy has served four terms for a combined total of 21 years as Elders on Session. Very well done, good and faithful servants!


Volunteers Needed!

Winter Weather Schedule Changes

In the event of winter weather affecting our area, Orange Presbyterian Church will make every attempt to hold Worship at 11:00 am. We will do our best to clear our parking lot and walkways to ensure the safety of members and visitors.



If the weather situation becomes unsafe, we will cancel services and activities at the church. Our practice is that the pastor (at present, our supply pastor) confers with the Clerk of Session to make the decision about cancelling the service. Shepherds are immediately notified to make calls to the members of their flock. We make every effort to contact the local radio and TV stations. You should check these television stations: WVIR TV - Channel 29, NBC; WVAW TV - Channel 16, ABC; WCAV TV - Channel 19, CBS. Radio station: WJMA - 103.1 FM.

ACT Loans Program is Launched

At the beginning of January, the Christian Emergency Council and UVA Community Credit Union (UVACCU) launched A Community Trusts (ACT) Loan Program to offer affordable loans to our neighbors who are the working poor. Thirty-five percent of the households in Orange County are the working poor or the impoverished, fifty-nine percent in the Town of Orange, sixty-two percent in Gordonsville. Far too often our working poor neighbors turn to predatory lenders for emergency loans charging up to 200% interest. ACT Loans can offer small loans up to \$2,000 at 9.9% interest for things like car repairs or tires, Division of Motor Vehicle fees that keep a working person from getting a driver's license, or a medical or dental need that can be dealt with in a timely manner so that time away from work is minimized. The idea is to help our neighbors in a crisis so that they avoid getting into deeper financial trouble. We can also assist them with educational or business dreams.

The launch of ACT Loans happened because of generous donations from individuals, churches, and denominational organizations within and beyond our county. We met our goal of raising \$10,000 in November of last year. The UVACCU matched our fundraising so that we have \$20,000 available for loans. We cannot overstate the appreciation we hold for UVACCU's partnership! Presently no loans have been offered but we are ready to go.

An essential service provided in ACT Loans is financial mentoring. We are excited that we have twelve trained volunteer financial mentors. By the way, financial mentoring is for anyone. One does not have to apply for a loan to take advantage of it. We are already mentoring some of our neighbors in budgeting and tracking of expenses.

The ACT Loans Oversight Committee members are Tom Pitz, President of the Christian Emergency Council, member of St. Thomas Episcopal Church; Bernice Washington, Adult Education Coordinator with the Department of Social Services, member of Blue Run Baptist Church; Vicky Schafer, retired from Virginia National Bank, member of Orange Baptist Church; Valencia Bailey, First Lady (Pastor's wife) of House Of God Tabernacle and co-founder of Good Samaritan Incorporation; and Rick Clore, retired pastor of Orange Baptist Church.

1. *Why?* by Adam Hamilton

Where is God when tragedy and suffering strike? When the ground shakes, and a poor nation's economy is destroyed; when the waters rise, washing away a community's hopes and dreams; when a child suffers neglect and abuse; when violence tears apart nations, where is God? If God is all powerful, and if each one of us is a beloved child of God, then how can God allow tragedy and suffering to mar his creation? In "Why?", best-selling author Adam Hamilton brings fresh insight to the age-old question of how to understand the will of God. Rejecting simplistic answers and unexamined assumptions, he lays out core ideas for comprehending God's plan for the world, including:

- § God will not take away our free will, even when we use it to grieve him.
- § God will never abandon us, especially in the midst of our suffering.
- § While God is not the author of suffering, God will bring blessing out of tragedy.
- 1. Christianity's Family Tree What Other Christians Believe and Why by Adam Hamilton

Learn more about the Christian histories and traditions of other denominations within the faith "family" as Adam Hamilton respectfully explains their similarities, differences and value within the Church. Eight denominations are discussed: Orthodoxy, Catholicism, Lutheranism, Presbyterianism, Anglicanism, Baptists, Pentecostalism, and Methodism (Reverend Hamilton's tradition).


