From the Pastor

Lately I've been exploring the difference between optimism and hope. While the word "hope" gets bantered around a lot about mundane topics (I hope I find my keys!), the word still retains a theological meaning worth lifting up, and clinging to in times of turmoil or anguish.

After the Sandy Hook tragedy, *Courage and Renewal* facilitator David Henderson wrote this:

"Optimism claims everything will be all right" despite reality. Hope accepts reality, the poverty of spirit that underlies all fear, instigates all tragedies, bureaucracy and institutional inertia....Optimism depends on the world's dark realities relenting - they will not. Optimism requires externals to work themselves out - they will not. Hope, on the other hand, doesn't ignore external realities; it simply knows the human heart's capacity to withstand those realities, and it trusts in the inexhaustible power of our hearts to choose love over fear."

And here is Rabbi Jonathan Sacks on the difference between optimism and hope:

"Optimism is the belief that things will get better. *Hope is the belief that, together, we can make things* better. Optimism is a passive virtue, hope an active one. It takes no courage to be an optimist, but it takes a great deal of courage to have hope. Knowing what we do of our past, no Jew can be an optimist. *But Jews have never - despite a history of sometimes* awesome suffering - given up hope." (from The Dignity of Difference)

As we approach Epiphany we maintain the same hope that stirred in



the hearts of those wise men from the east. Our own Presbyterian, Frederick Buechner, calls us to remember "... the hope that into the world the King does come. And in the name of the Lord. And is always coming, blessed be He. And will come afire with glory at the end of time." (A Room Called Remember)

We claim this hope, together, at Christmas and onward, most emphatically when we are TOGETHER. On our own we suffer from paralysis and discouragement. But together, we are the body of Christ. As we peek into the new year, and what it means for OPC, we do so with hope, that you will use your together-ness to bring about love even in times of fear, you will accept the coming of the Lord as a catalyst for new vision.


