- The Annual Chili Cook-Off will be held on March 10, following Worship.
- The 40th Anniversary Preschool Party will be held on April 14.

- A Farewell Coffee Fellowship for Margaret and Jack Thompson will be held on April 28, following Worship.
- A new Incentive Compensation Plan, discussed at the Annual Congregational Meeting by Covenant Review, was approved for the Administrative Assistant and the Director of Music with monies to be drawn from the Reserve Fund.
- Elders Joanna Davies and Carole Sue Graves attended the Presbytery of the James Stated Meeting on Saturday, February 16, at Three Chopt Church in Richmond.
- A planning retreat for members of session will be scheduled during the month of March.

Lenten Devotionals

The Season of Lent starts on March 6 (Ash Wednesday) and goes through April 21 (Easter). Lent recalls times of wilderness and wandering, from newly freed Hebrew slaves in exile to Jesus' temptation in the desert. To encourage the congregation to take the time to reflect on the meaning of Lent, the Worship and Music Committee has provided two different devotionals.

The first is in a contemporary magazine format, 2019 Presbyterians Today Lenten Devotional, Awakening to God's Beauty – A Lenten Invitation to Pray with Art. The text, meditations, and original photography are all the loving work of the Rev. Krin Van Tatenhove, long-time Presbyterian pastor, hospice chaplain, substance abuse counselor, and photographer. Relying on the powerful words of the Psalms, we peer at the heartbreaking ravages of the world through Jesus' eyes: social ills that afflict God's beloved children. But with God, there is hope.

For a traditional Lenten Devotional in book format, there is *A Way Other than Our Own*, by Walter Brueggemann. God has always called people out of their safe, walled cities into uncomfortable places, revealing paths they would never have chosen. Despite our culture of self-indulgence, we too are called to walk an alternative path - one of humility, justice, and peace. The thought-provoking reflections for the season of Lent invite us to consider the challenging, beautiful life that comes with walking the way of grace. For those in the congregation who read on electronic devices this book can also be purchased in Kindle form from Amazon. These devotionals will be available soon in the narthex.


Our total is 197 food items: 98 items were contributed to Love Outreach Food Pantry and 99 items were saved for our Blessing Box.



Presbyterian Women


