
Commitment Sunday - November 10 This Is My Story







Tax Benefit for You?

Do you need to take out a required minimum distribution (RMD) from your IRA this year? Although interest earned from your IRA generally is not taxed in the year earned, it isn't tax-exempt interest. Taxes on your traditional IRA generally are deferred only until you take a distribution. But there is a way not to pay taxes on the RMD.



Consult with your tax advisor first, and consider donating your annual pledge from your RMD and save yourself some taxes.

Medical Benevolence Foundation

The Medical Benevolence Foundation (MBF) is a Christ-centered

organization dedicated to healing lives by building sustainable medical ministries in developing countries. MBF partners with local churches in developing countries to equip them with tools and resources that allow them to meet the health care needs of its community. There are four specific ministries they use: Hospital and Clinic Support and Development, Critical Health Services for Women and Children, Nursing Schools and Scholarships, and Spiritual Ministry. The Mission and Outreach Committee at OPC has used our benevolence monies to support MBF for the past 30 years. On Sunday, November 24, Patrick Coughlin MBF Vice President will be here with us to preach and to celebrate this stewardship. You may learn more about MBF online at www.medicalmission.org.

Session Meeting Highlights

From the October 15 Stated Meeting:

Our Session Leadership Retreat, Part 2, was held on Saturday, October 26, from 9-12 in the East Room.

- The Safety Team continues to recruit members and will meet in November.
- A generous donation has been received by the Worship and Music Committee for the purchase of additional *Glory to God* hymnals.
- A new Memorial Book is being purchased and will bring us up to date on recording contributions.
- The Communications Team is planning to try two weekly emails; a Monday Memo for weekly activities and a Friday Memo for Sunday Worship and weekend activities.
- The Covenant Review Team recommended the formation of a Music Transition Team composed of one member from Worship and Music, one member from Covenant Review, and two members from the congregation (to be nominated by the Nominating Committee), the pastor, and the director of music as ex officio as needed. This team will facilitate and lead efforts to experiment with additional music variety and worship integration to help discern where God is calling us musically in Worship. Incorporating these insights, this team will operate simultaneously as a search committee. The motion carried.
- The Mission and Outreach Committee recommended the following, with all motions carrying:
 - 25% of the Peace and Global Witness Offering and the additional OPC T-shirt money be sent to Disaster Relief in the Bahamas.
 - 3 options to be offered for the Alternative Giving at the Holiday Bazaar Habitat for Humanity, Christian Emergency Council, and the Medical Benevolence Foundation.

- Donate food for three Thanksgiving Baskets for Habitat this year.
- Have a temporary clothesline for a hat, scarf, and glove ministry in January.
- Representatives from Session and the Pastor Support Team attended, "Healthy Pastors, Healthy Congregations," sponsored by the PC(USA) Board of Pensions at Blue Ridge PC on October 21.
- The Finance Committee recommended the following, with both motions carrying:
 - OPC has been approved for \$1,000 from Small Church Ministry for the replacement of the sanctuary air conditioning system. It was recommended that the remainder of the payment for this project be taken from the Capital Improvements Endowment Fund.
 - A pilot program for Online Giving to be conducted with members of the Finance Committee and Session on a volunteer basis.
- The Property Committee recommended the use of \$900 from the Hazard Fund for the removal of the boiler from the furnace room under the Fellowship Hall. The motion carried.
