

Peace & Global Witness Offering

October 7, 2018

The Peace & Global Witness Offering draws Presbyterians together and provides education and exposure to those who show us how to do this work well. It has helped our church partners in Madagascar recover from years of destructive development. Scriptural resources helped congregations, like the one in Old Bergen, New Jersey, find common ground with neighbors of many faiths, bringing their children together to learn from one another and to build a peaceful future. The whole church joins together through this Offering, to work for an end to all forms of human trafficking, specifically the use of child soldiers.



Fifty percent of this offering is used at the national level, 25% by the Presbytery, and 25% is kept and used locally.

We will collect this offering on World Communion Sunday, October 7, 2018.

Session Meeting Highlights

As part of our September session meeting, we collectively celebrated everyone's birthdays with cupcakes and lemonade.

Other highlights of our meeting included:

- We continue to review revisions of our OPC Administrative Manual. We reviewed and approved our Wedding Policy and the Duties of the Wedding Facilitator.
- Elder Amy McClung reported as our elected commissioner to the August 7 Called Meeting of the Presbytery of the James.
- The Worship and Music Committee will be asking the congregation to purchase copies of the new purple hymnal, Glory to God in honor or in memory of a loved one. Name plates will be placed in the newly purchased hymnals.
- Congregational Care reported that proceeds from the lobster sale, in the amount of \$150.87, will benefit the Music Fund.
- The OPC History Covenant Group requested that \$271.01 from the Memorial Fund be used to frame an architectural rending of our new sanctuary. The motion was approved.
- A discussion of the responsibilities of the newly formed Discipleship Team involved specific needs for the 2019 Stewardship Commitment Drive. Elder McClung will devise a plan for this drive, to be implemented in October. Be on the lookout for details!
- A recommendation was approved from Mission and Outreach that a potluck lunch be held on Sunday, September 23, to hear about ACT (A Community Trusts) Loans. The objective of this new program is to provide affordable loans to our

financially struggling neighbors
who are the working poor. The Christian
Emergency Council is a partner in this endeavor.

- A recommendation had been approved via email vote to use \$2,700 from the Capital Improvements Fund for the purpose of patching, filling cracks, and sealing the church driveway.
- Recommendations had been approved via email vote to approve expenditures from the Administrative Pastor Emergency Assistance budget for temporary housing for a homeless individual.
- A recommendation for the use of our Fellowship Hall for a Young Life middle school group, Wyldlife weekly meeting on Thursday evenings was approved.
- A draft of the Orange Presbyterian Weekday School - Orange Presbyterian Church Relationship Statement was reviewed and approved as an amended document to be reviewed by the preschool board of directors. Final approval of the document by session will be at our October meeting. A legal review will follow before final ratification of the document.

We promise to pray, alone and together, to thank God and to ask for God's help in our lives and in our work for our Church. We promise to listen and wait for God's answer.

Our Promises to Our Church Family

We promise as leaders to love and respect our members, to celebrate our differences and encourage the participation of all in the life of our church. We promise to support the mission of our church family, to do God's work in our community and in the world.

Our Promises to Each Other

We promise to respect and care for each other, to put a priority on trust and openness to create a safe haven for discussion and problem-solving.

While being mindful of our past, we promise to embrace change. We promise to look for new opportunities in the midst of disruption, relying on the guidance of the Holy Spirit in all matters.

We promise to actively resolve conflicts with love. We promise to have the courage to disagree, and respect viewpoints that disagree with ours. We promise to be open to compromise, considering all options to discern the path God wants us to travel.

We recognize the presence of the Holy Spirit at our meetings. We therefore promise to embrace the final decisions of the Session, whether they reflect our views or not, accepting that we were led to these decisions by God.

Pastor Nominating Committee

Your PNC has now been at work, meeting weekly, for 12 months. During that time, we have received and reviewed 127 Pastor Information Forms (PIFs). Why so many with no success? They come to us from all over the United States through a PC(USA) clearing house. Most of these candidates have never heard of Orange VA, and the match would not be a good fit for them or for us. We have followed up on promising ones with phone interviews, a Skype interview, and one visit to our ch



on promising ones with phone interviews, a Skype interview, and one visit to our church. There have been situations where the promising candidate could not relocate because of family obligations, spousal job conflicts, or health problems. Some simply failed to reply to our communications of interest.

It does get discouraging. The committee was told at the onset that it was not unusual for the process to take 12 to 18 months. Please bear with us. We continue to work diligently on your behalf to find the best candidate. Your interest, your patience, and your continued prayers are greatly appreciated.

Domestic Violence Awareness

As you read this sentence, a woman in the United States has become the victim of assault. Every 9 seconds, another woman is beaten or abused. Every 9 seconds.

It is a reality for 1 in 4 women who will experience domestic violence in their lifetime. It happens mostly at home, behind closed doors. It's not usually reported to the police. That doesn't mean it isn't visible, and it doesn't mean future generations are unaffected. Fifty percent of all women who are homeless report domestic violence as the immediate cause of their homelessness. Children who witness domestic violence are far more likely to be abusers or the abused when they grow up.

Domestic violence happens to people in all walks of life, regardless of age, gender, sexual orientation, race, religion, education, or socioeconomic status. Look around your community. One in four women. Think about that statistic. Every 9 seconds.

In this community we have SAFE, Services for Abused Families. They provide shelter for women and children who need it; they provide counseling and job skills workshops. SAFe works in all 5 counties of our Planning District.

Last year, SAFE talked with 103 people from Orange County. They provided advocacy services for 44 adults and 14 children. They gave emergency shelter to 4 adults and 8 children. The 24-Hour Hotline is 540-825-8876. All calls are confidential. Remember that people who suffer from domestic violence can be anywhere - in our church, in our place of work, in our circle of friends, in our families.

Here at Orange Presbyterian Church, we gather needed supplies to send to the Shelter. What might you need if you ran from home with your children in the middle of the night, afraid for your life?

During October, which is Domestic Violence Awareness month, OPC will highlight the services SAFE provides. When the items listed below are donated, it frees up funds to provide counseling, advocacy, and shelter services. Look for the house shaped box in the East Room for your donations.
