Pastor's Ponderings

**After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. **T And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers." Luke 2:46-47

As Christians we are called to walk in the ways of Christ throughout our lives. We are called to model Jesus' life here on earth. One of the things Jesus had in his life was an education. When Jesus was a young child, he learned, he asked questions, he grew in wisdom and stature.

A few weeks ago, we celebrated back to school by giving the students and teachers notebooks and prayed over the new school year. Education is important to the Christian life. Session Meeting Highlights

- Rebekah reported that her Big Tent experience went very well.
- OPC Leadership Retreat, Part 1, will be on Saturday, August 24 from 8:00 am to 2:00 pm.
- The Safety Team will be planning emergency procedures for OPC. Lynn Clements will be leading this effort, with recruiting underway for team members.
- The Property Committee has reviewed OPC's insurance policy and reports that all is in order.
- The flooring in the big preschool room was in need of improvement. Session approved the expenditure of up to \$3,000 for purchase and installation from the \$8,000 pass through account that was set up previously for use by the preschool if needed during the 2019-2020 academic year.
- Spiritual Formation activities for the fall include a new member class, a confirmation class, an adult faith explorers group, a youth faith explorers group, a youth group for middle and high school students, and a youth choir for ages 3-10. With our added Sunday morning activities, the Spiritual Formation Team recommended the hiring of a nursery supervisor for the hours of 9:30-12:30 each Sunday morning. The motion carried.
- The Finance Committee recommended that donations given in memory of Elinor Vasquez be given to the Preschool Board for use in buying items for the preschool. The motion carried.
- The Finance Committee recommended the continuation of a zero-based budget in planning

- for the 2020 budget with a recommended 2.09% payroll increase as appropriate. Committees and teams were asked to include hopes and dreams in their budget requests with justification. The motion carried.
- The Mission and Outreach Committee reviewed the use of Yard Sale and Bazaar proceeds as follows: \$1,000 to Habitat for Humanity (exclusive of Alternative Gift funds from the Bazaar), ½ of the remainder for preschool scholarships, and ½ of the remainder to Christian Emergency Council (exclusive of Alternative Gift funds from the Bazaar).
- The Nominating Committee is recruiting for nominations for session elders, Nominating Committee members, Endowment Committee members, and Covenant Review Team members for 2020.
- The Pastor Support Team continues to meet once a month on average.

The Youth Faith Explorers, ages 5-13, will meet between 9:45-10:30 am. We would love to have additional guides for this group! The curriculum is easy to use and requires little preparation. If you are willing, see any member of the Spiritual Formation Team: Karen, Ellen, Sandy, May, or Rebekah. During Worship, youth will stay with their families or do some quiet activities at the Pray Station table in the back of the sanctuary.

The Adult Faith Explorers will start out with a four-week discussion of Adam Hamilton's book, Enough - Discovering Joy through Simplicity and Generosity. Books are available on Amazon for \$7.76. It is not necessary to have a book - most of the discussion is based on the video viewed during class. We need facilitators! We have a Leader's Guide which makes facilitating easy. Bringing a Community of Churches Together

The Town of Orange Ministerial Association put together a Rise Against Hunger food-packing event, hosted by OPC. There were 118 volunteers in our Fellowship Hall working together to package 10,000 meals, and \$3,709 was raised additionally. Churches that were represented included OPC, Orange Baptist, St. Thomas Episcopal, Trinity United Methodist, Church of the Nazarene, and Anglican Fellowship. Babel on Mission

Who We Are:

We are a community-partnered English Language Learning Program situated in The Good Shepherd Lutheran Church. We believe that God calls us to be in community with each other; actively, not passively. This means, among other things, that we must reach out to our neighbors and facilitate the ability not just to understand each other's words, but to understand each



other as people. Our program does this by hosting a safe and welcoming environment for ESL adults to study together and participate in community events. Our goal is to allow the entire community to interact fully with each other, and thus bring the Kingdom of Heaven ever closer.

What We Do:

Tuesdays and Thursdays from 5 to 7 in the evening we offer a quiet, intimate classroom setting for our ESL families to study together. We have a well-qualified teacher to lead the classroom, as well as a permanent childcare provider to provide the adults with the free moments they need to focus on themselves. In addition to the twice-weekly classroom setting, we also plan and execute community excursions. In fact, we have a date set to take our students to Montpelier for a guided tour! The classroom setting gives the technical knowledge, and the excursion provides real experience with using conversational English in a common setting, without the pressure of being alone.

What We Need:

In order to be truly community-partnered, we need volunteers from within the community! We have a need for three types of volunteers at the moment.

Primarily, we need additional child-care support. As the school year begins, we will have an influx of parents who want to connect directly with their children's English-speaking teachers instead of relying on a translator. With this influx, we will need to provide multiple childcare workers in order to stay within state and local guidelines for childcare.

In addition to the extra childcare, we will need additional classroom support. This is not a traditional teaching assistant position, we are simply seeking fluent English speakers to be present in the classroom to help with simple learning exercises, such as counting, dates, and pronunciation. Fluency in Spanish is not necessary, nor is any official teaching experience required.

Finally, we are also on the lookout for volunteers to help with transportation, both to and from the classroom as well as cultural events. We are securing a 14-passenger van, which will not require any specialized license or experience to operate.

Our ideal situation is to have a large pool of interested individuals to reach out to each month and create a schedule of volunteers, so even if you think you might only be able to help out once or twice in a given month, that is perfect. Please send me an email so that I can add you to the contact list if you are interested!
